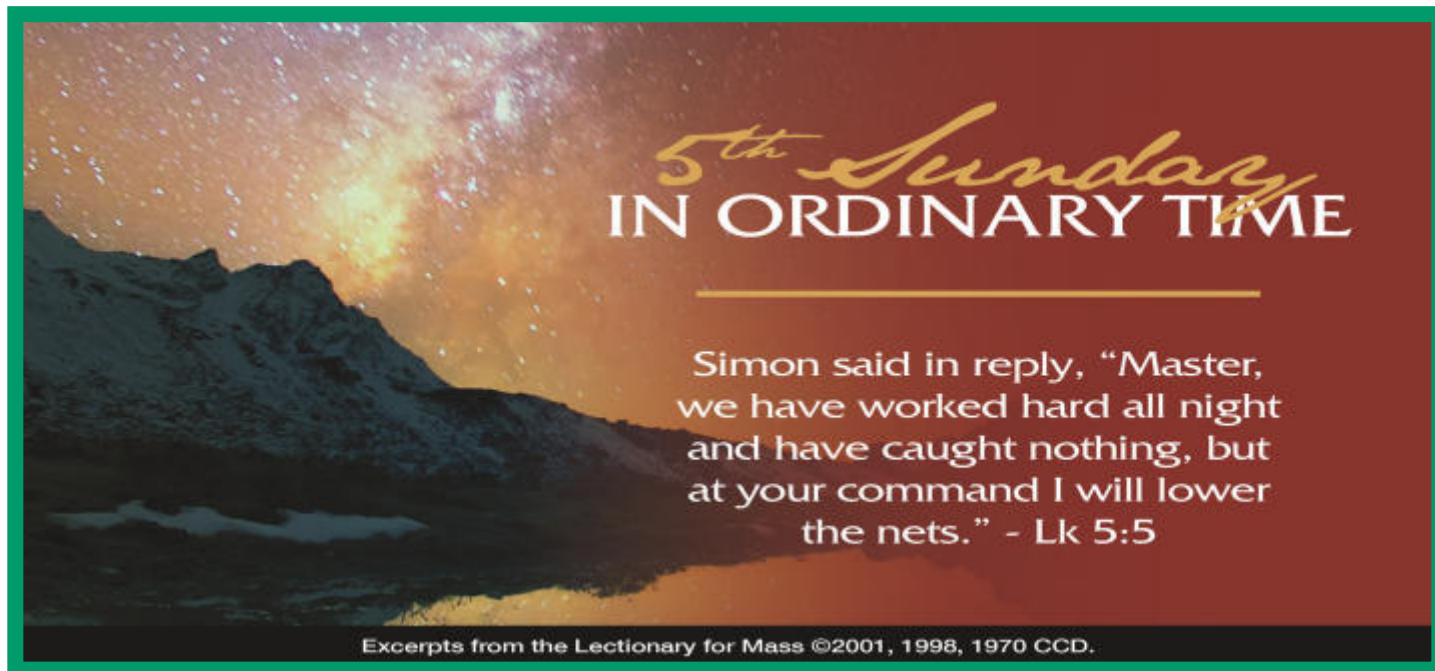

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

GOSPEL MEDITATION: Do you have enough? Many of us come from a nation of material abundance. We have all the things we could possibly need not only to survive, but to thrive - food, shelter, mental ability, income, access to medical care. Most people in human history lived with far less than we. So why are we so dissatisfied? Some Christians can be drawn to the "prosperity Gospel." This is the idea that following God will bring us material abundance in this life.

That surely seems to be the story of today's Gospel! Peter and his friends chose - with some faith - to put out their nets a final time at Jesus' command. "They caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that they were in danger of sinking." What gift! What abundance! What prosperity! Peter and his friends caught more fish than they'd ever seen. Yet what is their response to this material abundance, this gift from God? They leave it behind. "When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him."

Praying for God to meet our physical, material needs is not a bad thing! Jesus himself includes "give us this day our daily bread" in the prayer he teaches his disciples. The question is, how do we respond when our prayers are answered? Do we thank God briefly, or perhaps ignore Him completely and move on with our lives? Or do we respond as Peter did? "God? You showed up in an area that has no bearing on my eternal salvation. You gave me a gift I didn't even really need. You love me! You really do love me." Is our gratitude only surface level? Or do we allow ourselves, like Peter did, to respond with wonder, awe, and deeper discipleship?

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary time
Is 6:1-2A, 3-8 / 1 Cor 15:1-11 / Lk 5:1-22

It would seem that the word of the day is CONVERSION. In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah acknowledges his "unclean lips" (unworthiness) in the presence of the LORD of hosts, but with the aid of the seraphim his wickedness is removed and his sin is purged. He has been changed -- prepared, even -- to go and do the work of the LORD. In the gospel, we see Simon Peter go through a similar change, from a fisher of fish to a fisher of men. In both cases we see God taking an ordinary human and preparing him for an extraordinary mission. To be fully alive it requires conversion of heart and mind. When you look in the mirror, you may see an ordinary man or woman, but remember that you have been baptized into an extraordinary mission. Pray that God will reveal that mission to you and that you will be of heart and mind to accept that mission with enthusiastic gratitude

Parece que la palabra de hoy es CONVERSION. En la primera lectura el profeta Isaías reconoce tener "labios sucios" (impureza) en la presencia del Señor; pero con la ayuda del serafín, su impureza es removida y su pecado erradicado. Él ha sido cambiado y preparado para ir y hacer el trabajo del Señor. En el Evangelio vemos a Simón Pedro pasar por un cambio similar; de ser un simple pescador de peces, a ser un pescador de hombres. En ambos casos, vemos a Dios tomando a un ser humano ordinario y preparándolo para una misión extraordinaria. Para estar plenamente vivos, requiere una conversión de corazón y de mente. Cuando vez en el espejo, estás viendo a un hombre o mujer ordinario(a); pero recuerda, que tú has sido bautizado con el propósito de llevar a cabo una misión extraordinaria. Oremos para que Dios nos revele cual es nuestra misión y para que aceptemos esa misión con la mente y el corazón llenos de entusiasmo y gratitud.

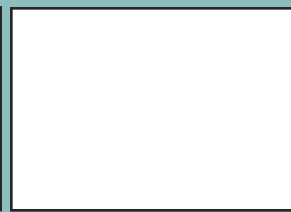

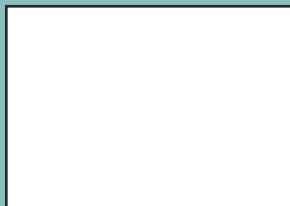
